

### **KINDERGARTEN & YOUNG FIVES LEARNING OVERVIEW**

Caledonia's Kindergarten and Young Fives programs are tailored to the kindergarten curriculum, emphasizing both math and literacy instruction alongside the nurturing of social and motor skills. These programs offer a supportive environment where students can engage with the curriculum at a pace suited to their developmental stage. Learning is facilitated through hands-on interactive experiences, fostering a well-rounded educational foundation for both Kindergarten and Young Fives students.

Young Fives is the first year of a two-year kindergarten experience, providing students additional time to develop foundational academic, social, and emotional skills before transitioning into kindergarten.



## **KEY AREAS OF LEARNING**

Students typically develop these skills as they progress through their Kindergarten and Young Fives experience.

#### **Language and Literacy**

- Identify letters and letter sounds
- Rhyme and identify rhyming patterns
- Understand syllabication
- Identify beginning sounds
- Recall sight words
- Listen to a story and answer questions about it
- Understand the concepts of print
- Sequence the events of a story
- Independently write name, draw, and attempt to write about pictures
- Begin to use letter combinations in writing

# Mathematics

- Identify numbers 0-20
- Count the number of objects up to 30
- Count 1-100
- Compare quantities of objects
- Understand basic math concepts
- Copy, complete, and extend a pattern
- Interpret graphs

#### **Social-Emotional**

- Demonstrate emotional regulation
- Listen attentively during instruction
- Follow 2–3 step directions
- Ask for help when needed
- Participate in small and large groups
- Demonstrate stamina during instruction and while completing tasks
- Engage cooperatively with peers
- Demonstrate positive social behaviors and problem-solving skills
- Practice appropriate play skills
